What difference can improving financial capabilities make to peoples lives?

- Improved employment sustainability
- Increase income
- Reduce debts
- Help people manage their finances
- Improve health stress/anxiety/physical health
- Improve living conditions
- Improve relationships







Common practical financial issues that are barriers to employment

- Perceptions about income changes
- Moving from 2 week payments to monthly
- Gap between last benefits payment and first payday
- Travel costs
- Childcare costs
- Disabilities what work can I carry out?
- Understanding tax
- Understanding payslips
- Notify people so they don't get into debt

- Benefits calculations
- Understanding in-work benefits entitlement
- Entitled to any other benefits?
- Budgeting skills
- Travel costs budgeting, Bike for Work Package

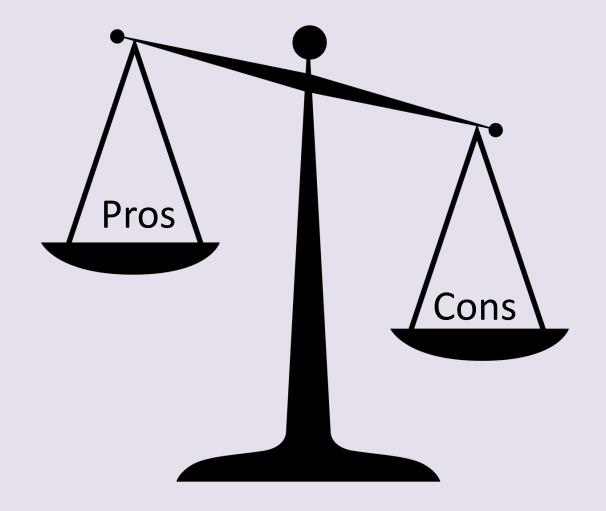

What has gone well:

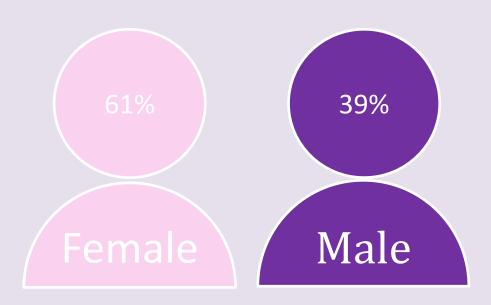
- BBO has allowed scope for us to develop an innovative model of both quality and scale of delivery
- Enables an intensive wrap around support for beneficiaries across the LCR removing any postcode lottery to accessing provision
- Advanced payments allow flexibility in delivery and assist organisational capacity
- Removed barriers to smaller and more specialised partners to access ESF funding and by accessing in this manor via BBO we have assisted in increasing our partners internal capacity enabling 9 to access further ESF programmes.
- Resulting in positive levels of engagement from traditionally underrepresented groups
- Offers accredited training for "community money mentors" allowing participants who have never previously gained a qualification to do so, improving self esteem, confidence and future prospects as well as helping their wider communities by disseminating financial information to friends, family and wider.

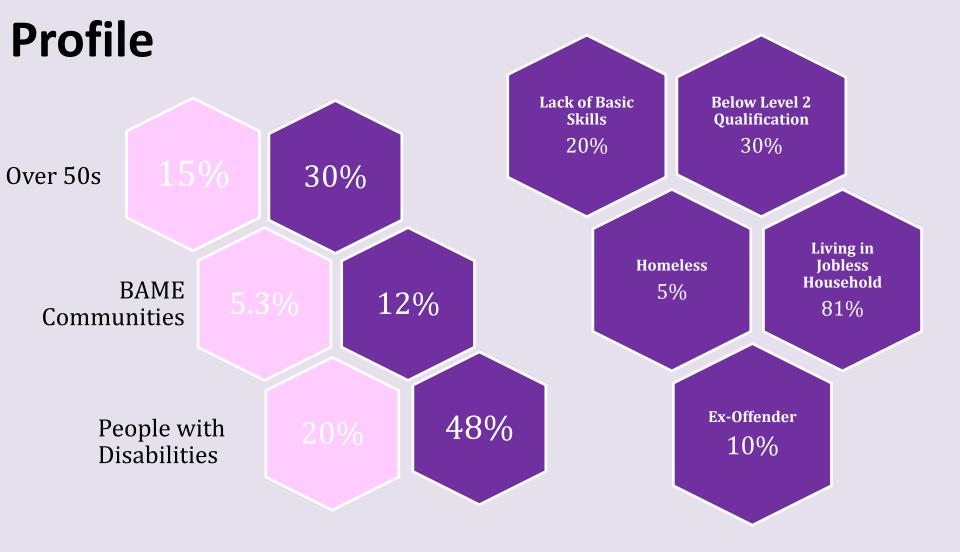

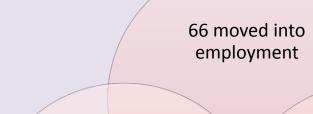








Achievements
